 20 Plaintiff F. MARC SCHAFFEL PRODUCTIONS, LLC ("Schaffel") alleges  
 21 as follows:

**THE NATURE OF THIS ACTION**

22  
 23 1. TMZ broadcast confidential video footage stolen from and without  
 24 consent of its owner, claiming exemption from copyright laws and immunity from  
 25 having to reveal the identity of the thief of the footage. TMZ asserts that its status  
 26 as a "news" provider exempts it from respecting copyrights, permits it to broadcast  
 27 purloined material, and insulates it from liability for lying about sources of illicitly  
 28 obtained materials. Relying on these shields, TMZ has disseminated and

1 commercially exploited a confidential stolen video produced and copyrighted by  
2 Schaffel which depicts highly private and sensitive thoughts and comments of  
3 Debbie Rowe (“Rowe”), the ex-wife of the internationally celebrated entertainer  
4 Michael Jackson, concerning her relationship with Michael Jackson and their  
5 children.

6 2. TMZ obtained and broadcast previously unpublished video outtakes of  
7 an interview with Rowe which were never intended for public disclosure. The  
8 outtakes were taken from Schaffel, the owner of same, without permission of either  
9 Schaffel or Rowe. TMZ falsely attributed the source of the video, first claiming on  
10 its website that it came from a British network, GMTV, then claiming it came from  
11 the Santa Barbara Sheriff’s Department as the fruit of a search warrant executed on  
12 Schaffel in connection with Michael Jackson’s child molestation charges, and  
13 finally claiming no obligation to reveal the true source of the stolen material.

#### 14 ALLEGATIONS COMMON TO ALL CLAIMS

##### 15 JURISDICTION AND VENUE

16 3. This action arises, in part, under the United States Copyright Act, 17  
17 U.S.C. §§101 et seq., based on acts of copyright infringement committed in the  
18 United States, as well as under the common law right of conversion under the laws  
19 of the State of California. This Court has subject matter question jurisdiction over  
20 this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§1331 and 1338, and supplemental jurisdiction  
21 over Plaintiff’s claims arising under California law pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1367,  
22 because they flow from a common nucleus of operative facts.

23 4. Venue is proper in this District pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§1391(b), (c)  
24 and 1400(a) because Defendants, and each of them, are subject to personal  
25 jurisdiction in this District and a substantial part of the events, acts and/or omissions  
26 giving rise to the claims herein occurred in this District.

THE PARTIES

1  
2 5. Schaffel is, and at all times relevant hereto has been, a limited liability  
3 company organized and existing under the laws of the State of California.

4 6. Schaffel is informed and believes and based thereon alleges that  
5 Defendant TMZ Productions, Inc. is a California corporation conducting business in  
6 the City of Los Angeles, State of California, which operates and does business as  
7 TMZ and that the gossip website Defendant "TMZ.com" is, and at all times relevant  
8 hereto, was, an entity of unknown type and origin that is, and at all times relevant  
9 hereto was, doing business in the City of Los Angeles, State of California.

10 Defendants TMZ Productions, Inc. and TMZ.com are collectively referred to as  
11 "TMZ."

12 7. Schaffel is informed and believes and based thereon alleges that  
13 Defendant Time Warner, Inc. ("Time Warner") is, and at all times relevant hereto  
14 was, a Delaware corporation with its principal place of business in New York, New  
15 York conducting business in the City of Los Angeles, State of California.

16 8. Schaffel is presently unaware of the true names and capacities of  
17 Defendants sued herein as Does 1 through 10, inclusive, and therefore sue said  
18 Defendants by such fictitious names. Schaffel will amend this Complaint to allege  
19 the true names and capacities of such fictitiously named Defendants when the same  
20 have been ascertained. Schaffel is informed and believes and based thereon alleges  
21 that each of the fictitiously named Defendants is responsible in some manner for the  
22 occurrences, acts and omissions alleged herein and that Schaffel's damages were  
23 proximately caused by their conduct. Hereinafter, all Defendants including Doe  
24 Defendants will sometimes be referred to collectively as "Defendants." For  
25 convenience, each reference to a named Defendant herein shall also refer to the Doe  
26 Defendants, and each of them.

27 9. Schaffel is informed and believes and based thereon alleges that at all  
28 material times Defendants, and each of them, were the agents, employees, partners,

1 joint venturers, co-conspirators, owners, principals, and employers of the remaining  
2 Defendants, and each of them, are, and at all times herein mentioned were, acting  
3 within the course and scope of that agency, employment, partnership, conspiracy,  
4 ownership or joint venture. Schaffel is further informed and believes and based  
5 thereon alleges that the acts and conduct alleged herein were known to, and  
6 authorized or ratified by, the officers, directors, and managing agents of Defendant  
7 corporations or business entities, and each of them.

### 8 FACTS COMMON TO ALL CLAIMS

9 10. Schaffel is the owner of a work entitled "Debbie Rowe Interview  
10 Produced and Directed by F. Marc Schaffel in Calabasas, California" ("Interview"),  
11 compiled and produced by F. Marc Schaffel in 2003 and consisting of an interview  
12 of Rowe, outtakes and other interactions with Rowe. Portions of the Interview were  
13 broadcast around the world in 2003. Other portions of the Interview were private,  
14 confidential and were never meant to be publicly released without the joint consent  
15 of Schaffel and Rowe (the "Confidential Outtakes").

16 11. Michael Jackson was indicted by the District Attorney, County of Santa  
17 Barbara, on charges of child molestation in December 2003. As part of the  
18 investigation, on or about January 31, 2004, the Santa Barbara County Sheriff  
19 ("County Sheriff") obtained and executed upon a search warrant on Schaffel's  
20 home. The search warrant itself specified that upon seizure, any property was to be  
21 kept in custody pending further order of the Court. Among the things seized were  
22 various videotapes and computer hard drives, some of which included the Interview.  
23 On November 1, 2005, the County Sheriff returned to Schaffel what was represented  
24 by the County Sheriff to be all of the property seized pursuant to the warrant.  
25 Schaffel has never conveyed or released the Confidential Outtakes to anyone.

26 12. On July 20, 2009, TMZ broadcast the Confidential Outtakes portions of  
27 the Interview which consisted of a casual and jocular conversation between an  
28 interviewer and Rowe joking about using sedation to combat stage fright that was

1 never intended to be publicly disclosed unless Schaffel and Rowe consented thereto.  
2 Schaffel and Rowe were stunned and distressed that TMZ, in a misguided attempt at  
3 gallows humor, broadcast the Confidential Outtakes, attempting to tie a 2003 joke  
4 by Rowe about drug use to Mr. Jackson's tragic 2009 death from a drug overdose.

5 13. Immediately upon airing of the Confidential Outtakes, Schaffel and  
6 Rowe demanded that the Confidential Outtakes be removed from any further  
7 dissemination and that TMZ's source for the Confidential Outtakes be provided. On  
8 July 24, 2009, TMZ removed the Confidential Outtakes from further broadcast and  
9 agreed to provide the source for the video. TMZ then identified the source of the  
10 Confidential Outtakes as the County Sheriff. After the County Sheriff vehemently  
11 denied being the source of the Confidential Outtakes for TMZ, on July 30, 2009,  
12 TMZ retracted its prior statement, and stated that the Confidential Outtakes had  
13 been obtained from another third party source which TMZ refused to identify.

14 14. Thus, six (6) years after the Interview had been completed, and  
15 notwithstanding the Confidential Outtakes were to remain private and confidential  
16 and to be released only upon the joint consent of Schaffel and Rowe, not only had  
17 TMZ wrongfully broadcast the Confidential Outtakes, but repeatedly lied about the  
18 source that had provided the Confidential Outtakes.

19 15. Schaffel has spent considerable time and effort in developing its  
20 standing as a producer in the entertainment industry. Through years of hard work,  
21 Schaffel has developed skill, reputation and notoriety so as to create considerable  
22 value in Schaffel. Schaffel has also provided and stood by assurances to its subjects  
23 that they could rely upon representations that its productions would remain private  
24 and confidential where agreed to. The broadcast by TMZ of the Confidential  
25 Outtakes has diminished the ability of Schaffel to attract subjects for production in  
26 the entertainment industry and has diminished the ability of Schaffel to license,  
27 distribute, or otherwise exploit the Confidential Outtakes in the event Schaffel and  
28 Rowe consented to same.

**FIRST CLAIM FOR RELIEF**

**For Copyright Infringement [17 U.S.C. ·101 et seq.]**

**(Against All Defendants)**

16. Schaffel repeats, realleges, adopts and incorporates each and every allegation contained in Paragraphs 1 through 15, inclusive, as though fully set forth herein.

17. Schaffel is the sole owner of all right, title and interest in the copyrights to the Interview (the “Copyrights”).

18. Schaffel is informed and believes and thereon alleges that Defendants, and each of them, have commercially used, exploited, attempted to license or sell and disseminated the copyrighted Interview.

19. Defendants’ commercial use, exploitation, attempts to license or sell and dissemination of the copyrighted materials is unauthorized. Defendants’ unauthorized commercial use, exploitation, licensing, attempts to license or sell and dissemination of the Interview constitutes an infringement of Schaffel’s rights, including of the Copyrights, and of the copyright laws.

20. As a direct and proximate result of Defendants’ infringing activities, Schaffel has sustained and will continue to sustain substantial injury, including damage to its business, reputation and goodwill in an amount not yet known but to be determined according to proof at trial. As a further direct and proximate result of the infringement by Defendants, they have unlawfully and wrongfully derived income and profits from their infringing acts.

21. Schaffel is informed and believes and on that basis alleges that Defendants had prior knowledge of Schaffel’s rights and, therefore, Defendants’ infringing activities are willful and wanton.

22. As a result of their actions, Defendants are liable to Schaffel for willful copyright infringement under 17 U.S.C. §501. Schaffel suffered, and will continue to suffer, substantial damage to its professional reputation and goodwill, as well as

1 losses in an amount not yet ascertained, but which will be determined according to  
2 proof. In addition to Schaffel's actual damages, Schaffel is entitled to receive the  
3 profits made by Defendants from their wrongful acts, pursuant to 17 U.S.C. §504.  
4 In the alternative, Schaffel is entitled to statutory damages pursuant to 17 U.S.C.  
5 §504(c). These statutory damages should be enhanced by 17 U.S.C. §504(c)(2)  
6 because of Defendants' willful copyright infringement.

## 7 SECOND CLAIM FOR RELIEF

### 8 **For Conversion**

### 9 **(Against All Defendants)**

10 23. Schaffel repeats, realleges, adopts and incorporates each and every  
11 allegation contained in Paragraphs 1 through 22, inclusive, as though fully set forth  
12 herein.

13 24. At all times relevant hereto, Schaffel was, and is, the sole and rightful  
14 owner of the Interview.

15 25. Although the Interview is unique and the value of control of same is  
16 irreplaceable, the Confidential Outtakes has an estimated value of potentially  
17 millions of dollars, the exact amount of which shall be proved at trial.

18 26. At some point and in some manner unknown to Schaffel, Defendants  
19 wrongfully and without Schaffel's authority or approval took or obtained possession  
20 of the Interview, and have converted the Interview for their own use and commercial  
21 gain.

22 27. As a direct and proximate result of Defendants' wrongful conversion of  
23 the Interview, Schaffel has been damaged in an amount that is not yet fully  
24 ascertainable.

25 28. Schaffel is informed and believes and based thereon alleges that the  
26 aforementioned acts of Defendants, and each of them, were done intentionally or  
27 with a conscious and reckless disregard of Schaffel, and with the intent to vex,  
28 injure or annoy Schaffel, such as to constitute oppression, fraud, or malice, thus

1 entitling Schaffel to exemplary and punitive damages in an amount appropriate to  
2 punish or set an example of Defendants, and each of them, to deter such conduct in  
3 the future, the exact amount of such damages subject to proof at the time of trial.

4 **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

5 **WHEREFORE**, Plaintiff Schaffel prays for judgment against Defendants  
6 TMZ and Time Warner as follows:

7 **AS TO THE FIRST CLAIM FOR RELIEF:**

8 1. That the Court enter judgment against Defendants, and each of them,  
9 that Defendants have:

10 (a) infringed Schaffel's rights in the copyright in the "Interview"  
11 under 17 U.S.C. §501, and that the infringement by Defendants, and each of them,  
12 was willful; and

13 (b) otherwise injured the business reputation and business of  
14 Schaffel through the acts and conduct set forth in this Complaint;

15 2. For the damages suffered by Schaffel as a result of the infringement  
16 complained of herein, as well as disgorgement of any profits of Defendants  
17 attributable to their infringement, including the value of all gains, profits,  
18 advantages, benefits, and consideration derived by Defendants from and as a result  
19 of their infringement of Schaffel's copyright in the Interview;

20 3. In the alternative, if Schaffel so elects, in lieu of recovery of its actual  
21 damages and Defendants' profits, for a 17 U.S.C. §504(c) award of statutory  
22 damages against Defendants, or any of them, for all copyright infringements (willful  
23 or otherwise) involved in this action as to the Interview;

24 **AS TO THE SECOND CLAIM FOR RELIEF:**

25 4. For an award of general and special damages against Defendants, and  
26 each of them, jointly and severally, for the value of the property converted, in an  
27 amount in excess of jurisdictional limits of this Court in accordance with proof at  
28 trial, together with interest thereon at the legal rate;



1 5. For damages for the proximate and foreseeable loss resulting from  
2 Defendants' conversion in a sum according to proof at the time of trial, together  
3 with interest thereon at the legal rate; and

4 6. For punitive and exemplary damages.

5 **AS TO ALL CLAIMS FOR RELIEF:**

6 7. For attorneys' fees and costs of the suit incurred;

7 8. For interest at the maximum statutory rate; and

8 9. For such other and further relief as the Court may deem just and proper.


